C. Engineer's Report (for informational purposes)

Ms. Suit stated that since the Engineer's Report was presented at the Organizational meeting, the total number of planned units is 659, total acreage is 198.59 and the total CIP is \$28,917,674.

D. Master Special Assessment Methodology Report (for informational purposes)

Ms. Suit stated the financing plan provides for the issuance of bonds in the appropriate approximate principal amount of \$38,410,000 to finance the approximate \$28,917,674 in CIP costs. It is amortized for 30 years with a 24-month capitalized interest period. Assessments will be levied on 198.59 gross acres, in an equal pro-rata gross acreage basis.

 Hear testimony from the affected property owners as to the propriety and advisability of making the improvements and funding them with special assessments on the property.
